Summary of your organization's response to Hurricane Matthew

The Salvation Army's two state, simultaneous response to Hurricane Matthew continues. Mass feeding and hydration operations have been the focus since pre-landfall. Meals have been prepared and served from Salvation Army mobile kitchen unit canteens and catering trucks; in some locations, food provided by the American Red Cross and prepared by NC Baptist Men is being served by The Salvation Army. Other Salvation Army sites without a mobile kitchen canteen unit used their existing facilities to prepare and serve meals. Additionally, Emotion + Spiritual Care workers have been deployed to support those impacted.

A faith based organization; the Knights of Columbus has a long history of lending a helping hand in times of distress.

The Knights of Columbus worldwide consists of 15,342 councils and 1.9 million members throughout the United States, Canada, the Philippines, Mexico, Poland, the Dominican Republic, Puerto Rico, Panama, the Bahamas, the Virgin Islands, Cuba, Guatemala, Guam, Saipan, Lithuania, Ukraine, and South Korea.

The Knights of Columbus has provided assistance in the wake of the 9/11 attacks in 2001, in addition it has also led a multimillion-dollar recovery effort in Louisiana in the aftermath of Hurricane Katrina. In addition, Knights were on the ground with supplies in a matter of hours after Superstorm Sandy devastated the Eastern seaboard.

In 2013, Knights responded to disasters in West, Texas; Moore, Okla.; and Alberta, Canada. When Typhoon Haiyan struck central Philippines in late 2013, the Supreme Council approved \$860,000 for humanitarian relief.

After the historic forest fire in Fort Murray, Alberta, Canada, the Knights of Columbus helped raise CA\$76,000 to benefit families affected by the devastation.

The Knights also raised \$30,000 for families in Houston, Texas, to assist St. Vincent de Paul's "House in a Box" program, which provides the bare essentials (bed, table, chairs, linens and other items) to families who have lost their homes in the area's recent massive floods.

First and Second Responders fighting wild fires in Roundup, Mont., were served over 350 meals by local Knights, while people impacted by severe flooding in Charleston, W. Va., were provided with clean water, cleaning supplies, fans and dehumidifiers. The funds were raised through the Knights of Columbus Disaster Relief Fund, with \$12,000 raised in one weekend alone to serve the local emergency.

The North Carolina Council, new to NC VOAD, consists of more than 17,000 members in more than 100 councils throughout the state of North Carolina.

The Knights of Columbus commits resources to meet the needs of people affected by disaster without discrimination as to race, creed, gender or age.
