Emergency Management Oversight

Kevin Landers- Assistant Director for CDBG-DR. He will oversee program implementation functions. Will hire Community Revitalization Manager, Housing/Construction Manager and 4 CD Specialists who will work with counties on program oversight. Budget and Infrastructure staff are already on board.

To expedite construction activities, Emergency Management will utilize Construction Managers at Risk (CMR's) to work with counties on construction related activities.

- Tier II counties State DRA Award Letters mailed 10/18 under review Pitt, Harnett, Duplin, Johnson, Pender, Lenoir, Bladen, Columbus, Sampson - up to \$10 million in housing related activities.
- CDBG-DR applications for 46 counties - Due October 20th

Proposed Amendment - Due to HUD November 7th

- Additional \$37,976,000 of CDBG-DR funding proposed. Tier I counties will also receive 80% of this allocation – stipulated by HUD. Not a lot of changes – but updating unmet needs analysis.
- Proposed changes include:
 - Addition of Housing Buy-Out/Acquisition as an eligible program activity.
 - More information about Economic Development activities.
 - Permitting Hurricane impacted PHA's as an eligible program activity.
 - Proposing additional funding to non-Tier I counties.
 - Will amend income eligibility from 60% to 80% of AMI.
 - Public meetings October 17, 18, 24, 30 in Lumberton, Fayetteville, Windsor and Raleigh. Meeting in Raleigh October 30 at the Rural Economic Development Center. Carya Drive 11 am. Meeting will coincide with Public Hearing for State's regular CDBG program which will start at 9.
- Substantial Amendment will be made available for public comments – October 18th through October 31st. Posted on DOC's website and ReBuild NC website.
