<p>WARM provided immediate tarping needs for homeowners already on our waiting list, under construction, or recently completed following the storms. We continued to receive applications for rebuilds for owner-occupied homes. As of June 30, 2019 WARM has completed 57 Hurricane Florence rebuilds with 29 more currently under construction. We have received volunteers from as far away as North Dakota, Nebraska, Louisiana, and Connecticut. We have received Hurricane Florence Recovery money from as far away as Colorado and California.</p> <p>Our Executive Director and myself are the co-chairs for the construction committees for the newly formed LTRGs in each of the three counties that our organization serves. Through these committees we have formed and renewed relationships with other organizations also working on recovery and rebuilding of homes.</p>

<p>WARM provides health- and safety-related repairs for low-income homeowners using mainly volunteer labor.
